Why Walkers and Cyclists?

- A growing market seeking outdoors experiences. This has increased during Covid-19, especially domestic visitors.
- ▶ All year round
- Over 500million walking trips made to the English countryside with associated expenditure of £6.14billion
- Cycling tourism spend is £520million, and 1.23m overnight cycling trips. Average spend of £360 per trip.
- ▶ Good public transport from London, the south east and Northern Europe
- Local and very local audience on our doorstep
- Contribution to the rural economy walkers and cyclists stay longer and spend more. They are often looking for more things to do, and incorporate an over-night stay to give them time
- ► Can explore less well known places, thus dispersing tourist 'honey-pots', or towns

- Long distance walkers and hikers
- ▶ Adventurers looking for challenge! Pre-kids, combine with other activities, eg kayaking
- ► Families who want kids to explore the outdoors
- ▶ Social walkers <4miles combined with a pint, or cream tea

How to make your business stand out to this market

Know your area

- Know your local routes this will dictate your cycling market (off road, road cyclists, families)
- Review your web-site how do people reach you make it very clear and include all transport types.
- What is special about your location AONB, near to NDW, promoted routes, nearby amenities - promote these online
- ► What other local businesses or attractions are around you could you work with them?

Practical actions

- A warm and friendly welcome in all weathers!
- Have local walking and cycling maps and information available eg maps and leaflets, cycle hire, cycle paths, as well as longer distance. Access to Explore Kent or online mapping services.
- Instructions for reaching your business by bike or on foot on your website
- > Space available for drying outdoor clothing and footwear
- > Boot scrapers, and/or access to water & stiff brush for cleaning
- > Water bottles filled for free, and flasks filled
- Somewhere safe to store backpacks
- > First aid kit for minor scrapes and details of nearest hospital etc

For Cyclists

- Safe place to lock up bikes (consider lockable and well-lit storage if overnight)
- Puncture repair kits and basic tools such as a pump
- Knowledge of cycle repair shops
- Knowledge about local cycle routes for different skill levels
- Nearest cycle hire for interested casual bikers who don't have suitable bikes
- ► Laundry facilities on site or signposted to
- Accommodate groups

Extra touches

- ► Consider the weather if its cold or wet a cosy fire and a hot drink goes a long way, if its warm cold drinks and ice-cream
- Special walkers tea and cake / hikers breakfast / local ale
- ► Hot baths, foot spas
- Walking/cycling magazines and books to browse
- Guided tours
- Early breakfasts/ packed lunches (at a charge)
- ▶ Baggage transfer for walkers doing linear routes (at a charge)
- Overnight drying service
- 'Netwalk' with other local businesses to build up knowledge and add-on experiences.
- Ebike charging
- ▶ Mechanical knowledge (puncture repairs etc) or even roadside support
- Bikes available to borrow

Promotion

- Online make finding information and making a booking frictionless.
- Publicise your walkers and cyclist welcome facilities and look for suitable channels
- Join Cycling UK's Cyclists Welcome directory
- ► SEOs check for keywords national trails, walking, cycling
- Use inspiring pictures and images
- ► Tag the North Downs Way/National Trails and Kent Downs AONB on your social media.
- ► Make it easy for potential visitors to extend their experience with suggested itineraries
